Like human beings, cities differ in character as well as in appearance. These individual traits of cities underlie variations in the amounts and types of social breakdown which they are likely to experience. Unless these differences are taken into account, it is dangerous to attempt to make intercity comparisons of social breakdown rates. Comparisons are often deceptive and misleading unless the relative vulnerability of the cities has also been compared. The urgent need for an index of vulnerability to social breakdown was acutely recognized when New Jerseys Division of Community Services for Delinquency Prevention was created.
